# THIS WEEK'S HIGHLIGHT Mother's Day 2018

"But I have calmed and quieted my soul, like a weaned child with its mother; like a weaned child is my soul within me." — Psalm 131:2

Happy Mother's Day to our great-grandmothers, grandmothers, mothers, mothers, mothers-to-be, guardians, and women who nurture those who are loved like children.

Our American holiday was proposed in the early 1900s by Anna Jarvis, a proud daughter who began the observance at her Methodist church in West Virginia as a way of honoring her late mother, who nursed wounded soldiers rom both the North and the South during the Civil War. Ms. Jarvis believed her mother and women like her should be honored by their nation. Her work gained the support of the Sunday School Association and the attention of President Woodrow Wilson, who first designated the second Sunday in May as a national holiday in 1914. The celebration caught on so well that Ms. Jarvis tried to undo her work in later years, decrying the commercialization of the day.

She had the right idea. What moms treasure most on their holiday is not what gets bought, but the expressions of love any day: an unexpected hug, volunteering to help with dinner, folding a basket of laundry, saying thank you for a ride to practice.

The Bible says mothers are our teachers. They offer wisdom and "the teaching of kindness is on her tongue." Their greatest lesson for us is to reflect God's tender care. Mothers model God's willingness to quiet our souls, His desire to see us thrive, His provision of food for our souls, His comfort in loss, His patience as we grow. We are blessed.

Today, give thanks to our Creator God for godly mothers. And, take a minute to tell a mom you know how much she means to you.
