THIS WEEK'S HIGHLIGHT The PCA General Assembly's Historic Choice

"There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is no male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus." — Galatians 3:28

On June 12, at the Presbyterian Church in America's 46th General Assembly, Dr. Irwyn Ince was unanimously elected as its moderator. Ince is a teaching elder in the Potomac Presbytery, the director of the GraceDC Network Institute for Cross-Cultural Mission (ICCM), and the first African-American to be elected as PCA moderator.

A second career seminarian, Ince studied for the ministry as a part-time student at RTS Washington, D.C. while working full-time as an engineer for Motorola. He became a pastor in 2006 and earned his DMin. in 2016.

In an article for the PCA's *byFaith* magazine, Ince talked about his grandmother, who in 1947 was one of millions of African-Americans who left the oppressive South to carve out lives with more freedom. Ince said, "Over the course of 60 years, millions of people — all God's image bearers, fed up with segregation, oppression, inequality, and an array of dehumanizing policies and attitudes — were induced to leave the southern states. When the PCA considered the [2015] personal resolution on confession and repentance for sins committed during the civil rights period, I could not help but connect our denomination's history to my family's story."

For Pastor Kevin Smith, who mentored Ince during his years as a seminary student and remains his close friend, this was a particularly proud moment. He said, "To see an African-American teaching elder as moderator is one of the great moments in our denomination. We still have a ways to go, but it says to the watching evangelical world that the PCA is not just talking kingdom diversity but pursuing it for the sake of the Great Commission."
