MINISTRY HIGHLIGHT: REFORMATION SUNDAY

This week our congregation is joining in the celebration of the anniversary of Martin Luther's public post on the door of the church in Wittenberg, Germany. A devoted monk, Luther had committed himself to the study of Scripture. God used Luther's scholarly pursuit to draw him to Himself. The Holy Spirit gave Luther an understanding of God's sovereign rule over all of creation and the enormity of His love for His children. Luther saw that God's word was unambiguous. The truth about man's helplessness and God's grace could not be confused. The Apostle Paul made the case in his letter to the church in Ephesus. Paul put it plainly; sin brings death and dead people have nothing to contribute to their salvation. "For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast" (Ephesians 2:8,9).

Luther's attempts to privately share what he learned with his superiors so they might change their unbiblical views were met with charges of heresy. Luther was warned to be silent. He could not comply. Instead, he dared to break with tradition and trust the future to God alone.

Martin Luther could not have imagined how God would use his act of defiance and courage. We remember Luther as a founder of a revolution that we can join in now. Dr. Robert Godfrey, a Fellow of Ligonier Study Center, renews the call that Luther found in Scripture and answered in the 16th century with this message to us:

"Paul's call to thoughtful vigilance is needed more than ever. Ministers, elders, and church members today must be renewed in the truth by a full and careful knowledge of doctrine contained for us in the great confessions of the churches. Then we will know where and when to fight, as well as the truth for which we fight. As Paul wrote to Timothy: "Keep a close watch on yourself and on the teaching. Persist in this, for by so doing you will save both yourself and your hearers" (1 Tim. 4:16).
