

## Getting to Know Someone

### **Meeet Someone**

Introduce yourself, remember the person’s name, and maintain good eye contact.

### **Initiate Conversation**

Start with closed questions (yes/no questions) and then move to open questions. Pick up on any area of interest the person might have and begin to inquire

### **Guide the Conversation**

As you get to know this person, move the conversation from superficial to deeper, more personal areas. Become a master at asking questions and listening with your eyes and heart.

### **Stoore and review information**

It’s a challenge, but after meeting each person write down everything you can remember about each. Review contacts weekly, and this becomes a prayer list. When you see these students on campus, you will be able to bond with them as you remember details of their lives. It helps you win the right to share the Gospel.
