## Prayer Guide for the week of December 26, 2021

**Sunday – Our Families and Neighbors** - Pray that God will open our hearts to the people around us and most of all, that their hearts will be open to the love of Christ. Pray that our warm wishes will reflect our prayers for God's grace. Pray we will freely share all the gifts God has given us to bless others. Pray that we will be kind in action and words. Pray we will be marked by our joy and our hope in Christ alone.

Monday - Our Supported Workers of the Week – Randy & Joan Nabors serving in Chattanooga, TN - Randy is the Urban & Mercy Coordinator for Mission to North America with New City Network. Pray for them as they plan and prepare to spend six months in London to help with New City Fellowship in Shepherd's Bush beginning in April 2022. Pray for the trips they have planned over the next few months to visit the different networks around the United States to strengthen and encourage them. Pray that God would raise up new church planters, new interns and trainees, fresh resources of talent and passion to go and live out the church where people desperately need the light of the gospel.

**Tuesday – Healthcare Workers** - Pray for the health care workers who are working long hours in difficult circumstances in senior living centers, hospitals, and health care facilities. Pray for peace and steadfast faith as dangers increase and opposition grows. Unreached People Group – Gujarati in Myanmar (Burma) – There are 35,000 Gujarati remaining in Myanmar after the Burmese government tried to force out this people group in 1962. They are known for their business acumen and honesty. Most Gujarati are Hindu and worship Krishna and Jain gods. Pray that the church in Myanmar would overcome its own nationalism to reach out to the Gujaratis within their communities. Pray that the Holy Spirit would lead Christ's ambassadors to "people of peace" who can open Gujarati communities to begin their own movement to Christ. Pray the Holy Spirit would prepare Gujaratis to be open to that witness and to be open to acknowledging their sinfulness before God.
