Growing Deeper Together: Understanding and Responding to the New World of Sexual Identity

BLAIR SMITH COMMUNITY LIFE CENTER 1 & 2

This class format will be regularly offered in Sunday School, though the class content will change from semester to semester. The first half of class will be fellowship and discussion around eight-person tables, led by hosts. Then, the second half of class will feature a lecture applying the themes of the content.

In this semester's content, we will explore together the questions of how the world arrived at its current, disorienting state of identity politics, and how the church should respond. We will use Carl Trueman's recent book, Strange New World: How Thinkers and Activists Redefined Identity and Sparked the Sexual Revolution, as an outline. Trueman follows the history of Western thought to the distinctly sexual direction of present-day identity politics and explains the modern implications of these ideas on religion, free speech, and personal identity.

Hearing Job's Complaint: A Fast-Paced Interactive Exploration of the Book of Job

Only Be Strong and Very Courageous: A Study in the Book of Joshua

Three times God says, "Be strong and courageous." Each time God gives the command to Joshua, He also gives him a reason why he should be strong and have great courage:

- · You will lead the people to inherit the land I promised them (be strong because I am going to do something great through you). Joshua 1:6
- \cdot I am the one who has commanded you (be strong because I know what I'm doing). Joshua 1:7
- \cdot I will be with you through the whole campaign (be strong because I've got your back). Joshua 1:9

Our study centers around God calling Joshua to lead the people of Israel in holy conquest of the land of Canaan. God marvelously laid bare His mighty arm in protecting His people from danger and from relentless enemies, revealing His omnipotence and loving care. After forty years of wandering in the wilderness, Israel claimed their inheritance and entered the land. Beyond the invasion and possession of a land, we will see them face issues which also touches our lives and faith today. And just as they enjoyed the blessing that God had prepared for them, God wants us to experience that same kind of life today. As we face the challenges of life, God wants us to know that He has not left us to "fend for ourselves." He is with us.


GINNY JOYCE, AARON MAYES & TIPHANY SPECK **WORSHIP CENTER 105**


- Nursery (newborn—toddlers) is located in the Worship Center
