A. The kingdom was a dominant emphasis in the teaching of Jesus
1. Definition of kingdom –
2. Jesus taught the kingdom has now arrived on earth in century one;

b. Role of John - <u>Mark 1:14-15</u>
c. This becomes a main theme. The term kingdom of God occurs over how many times in
the synoptic gospels: Kingdom of heaven is a synonym.
Kingdom is <i>Basileia</i> 54X Matt, 20X Mark, 46X Luke, 5X John.
d. Jesus' miracles, teachings, death and resurrection inaugurated the kingdom of God; It
was now present in Jesus. <u>Luke 8:10</u> ; <u>Lk 10:11</u> ; <u>Lk. 11:20</u> ; <u>Lk. 17:20-21</u>
3. He taught that the kingdom was yet to come: with return of Christ

b. When the future kingdom arrives it comes with

B. Jesus taught about the <u>Holy Spirit</u>
1. Jesus experienced the presence of the SpiritMt. 3:16-17
2. Jesus was aware that the Spirit was empowering his mission. Mt. 12:28
* Applies Isaiah 61:1 to himself. Read at synagogue in Nazareth (Lk. 4:18-19)
3. Jesus teaches that the disciples would have the Spirit's guidance when they
are <u>Mt. 10:19-20</u>
4. Jesus teaches that the Spirit is active in <u>Jn 3:5-6</u>
5. Jesus teaches that the Spirit is active in enabling our worship. Jn. 4:23-24
6. Jesus teaches in his farewell discourses in the upper room some significant new truth about
the Holy Spirit, the third person of the Godhead. <u>John 14-17</u>
