IN PREPARATION

Psalm 110 is a high-water mark for the Christian. It is messianic, royal, and priestly. It speaks to worship, judgment, holiness, and is eschatologically triumphant. Our readings point especially to verse 4 and the unchangeable nature of the Lord's plan while our songs emphasize Christ's kingship. Also, we will have an opportunity to sing a version of Psalm 110. Setting the phrases and truths of the Scriptures in our hearts over time is an important part of worship, especially when it comes to this psalm.

But avoid irreverent babble, for it will lead people into more and more ungodliness, and their talk will spread like gangrene. Among them are Hymenaeus and Philetus, who have swerved from the truth, saying that the resurrection has already happened. They are upsetting the faith of some. But God's firm foundation stands, bearing this seal: "The Lord knows those who are his," and, "Let everyone who names the name of the Lord depart from iniquity."
