- 3) Praise for the REACH gathering (annual sports ministry gathering) at The NAZ Church in Columbus, OH, where CEDE SPORTS staff led seminars on multiple topics like Redeeming Sports and Fitness, Measuring Ministry Success, Transformational Local Church Coach Development, and more.

4) Women in the SRF ministry saw 17 new ladies join the community with monthly calls that saw great impact, unity, vulnerability and trust. Over 75 ladies are in this community.

- 5) To reach full support in 2026, I need to raise \$12,000 in additional funding or \$1000/month. Pray for more financial supporters. Pray that God continues to move as a provider in all areas of my life.
